Directions to West Johnston High School

West Johnston High School

West Johnston High is a brand new \$32 million, 260,000 square foot high school designed by Hite Associates of Greenville, NC. It is the first high school built in Johnston County in 30 years. It is a modern thermal storage facility with the latest technology. Designed for 1700 students, the enrollment is currently 900+ due to only grades 9-11 attending this year. It has all the athletic fields, tennis courts, and programs this year except for varsity football due to not being able to get in the conference. The mechanical platform design allows technicians to change filters and work on equipment without interfering with classes. A 600 seat auditorium will accommodate school and community meetings and presentations. It is the largest structure built at one time in Johnston County.
